"Branch Organizational Capacity Assessment- BOCA is a self-assessment tool developed for branches of National Societies to identify and assess their strengths and weaknesses in relation to a wide range of organizational capacities which then lead to strengthening relevant, focused and sustainable local services which can be scaled up to a national level.


BOCA has 3 objectives:

1)To refresh local vulnerability analysis and a complementary appreciation of the organizational capacities of the branch and how it is currently performing

2) To reach a consensus on priorities for branch enhancement;

3) To develop an operational plan to strengthen and sustain its services delivery capacity and resilience of the communities.

However, BOCA is not about testing or examining the branch, but rather about identifying - through a selfassessment exercise – the current capacity of the branch, and agreeing on areas for further enhancement. It can inspire the branch to work harder for the improvement of their local humanitarian impact and regularly reassessed relevance after going through the process and understanding more clearly which areas need attention and gathering momentum on how to collectively address the issues that arise. As part of this exercise process, each branch have developed their Action Plans based on the findings collected at the end of the BOCA exercise, in each branch across the country.





Penama Red Cross branch office has been relocated to a new site in Loltong.

Staffs and volunteers have partitioned the building to create friendly office spaces, to accommodate 3 recruited staffs under the European funded Project, for the implementation of a Community Resilience activities on the island.

The island of Pentecost was severely impacted by TC Harold in 2020 and VRCS was in the forefront of emergency response providing life saving services. The Project "supporting communities Resilience" was directly focused on the island to contribute towards food security, Waster Sanitation and Hygiene. An MOU was signed between community chiefs and VRCS to enable a clear and better outstanding of roles and responsibilities of both parties.

"Disaster Risk Reduction in schools " activity, under International Youth Corporation Program, targets several schools around the country, including Lini Memorial College on Pentecost Island. The safety of school is important "at reducing the vulnerability to, and impact of disasters on schools". It prepares both teachers and students for potential disasters by reducing the impact of said disaster.

Hygiene promotion is one of the program in the National Society that empowers our communities by ensuring that the program is a part of all water and sanitation activities .Volunteers continue to reach out to help communities to be able to examine existing hygiene behaviour and understand how transmission of diseases takes place and how it can be prevented at a household level.

In partnership with Oxfam, the Cash Transfer Program has targeted people living with disability as beneficiaries. During the months of implementations, VRCS volunteers assisted in registering beneficiaries and distributed a pay card with credit on it through the Oxfam program. This enables the beneficiaries and their families to decide what they need and wish to purchase and restores dignity and choice to the beneficiaries, across a network of local shops and vendors.



TAFEA PROVINCE



PROGRAM

4 Red Cross staffs and volunteers took part in the Unblocked Cash transfer Program in Tafea Province. They have gained a wealth experience coordinating the program in Tanna for six months from December 2020 to May 2021 . Their hard work provided 398 vulnerable families in the White Sands area council with a card that allowed them to purchase goods and services based on their individual family needs.

The ongoing ash fall in White Sands area at North East Tanna continue to affect the livelihoods of the people, particularly agricultural root crops that communities rely on for their daily survival. Branch Board took the initiative through their established network with chiefs and Community based volunteers to mobilize non affected communities to donate food from their garden to neighbouring affected villagers at llarang.

The ongoing partnership with the Department of Water resulted with the engagement of 10 volunteers who assisted the Department in collecting data information in 23 community from Tanasul tribe. This activity is to enable the installation project of a GFS system for the tribe.

Staffs, board members and volunteers participated in a 3 days workshops facilitated by BOCA facilitator Ms Marie Keiruan. BOCA is a comprehensive assessment tool that provides an in -depth view of a branch's strengths and weaknesses, and allows them to assess their current capacity to deliver services to initiate or strengthen their overall development. Branches are the service arms of the organization in the community, responding directly to the needs of the most vulnerable. BO-CA also allows HQ to provide support in cases where recurring weaknesses in branches are identified .

- 8. Each year the World Red Cross Day is celebrated across the globe according to a theme, and this year's theme was *#Unstoppable*










