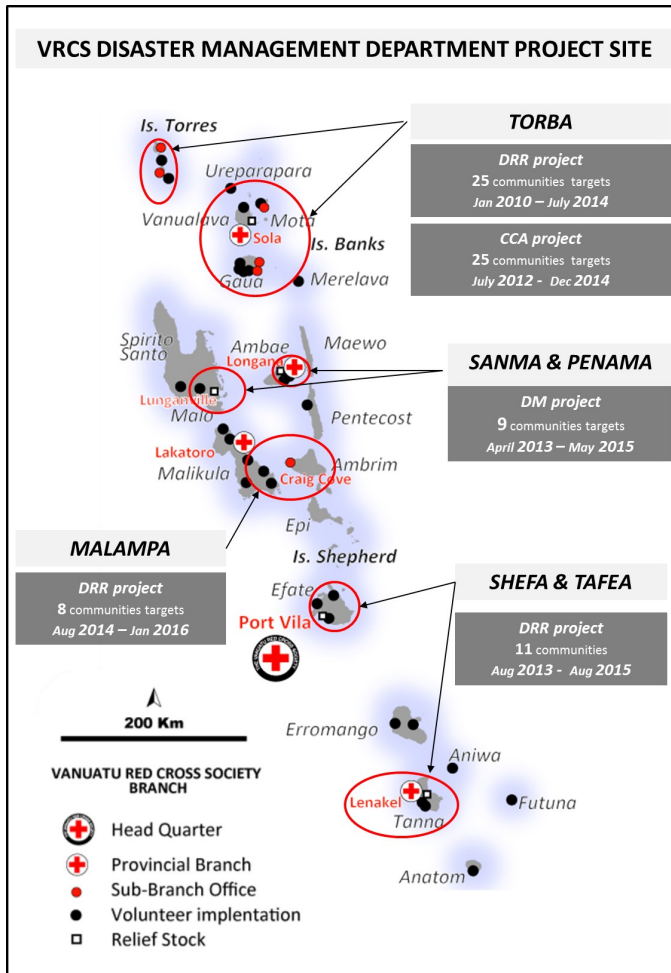




**Presentation of the VRCS -

The Vanuatu Red Cross Society (VCRS) support by French Red Cross (FRC) has been working with the National Disaster Management Office (NDMO) to strength disaster management capacity at the national, provincial and community level since 2010. This Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) program has been developed in Torba province then replicated in Sanma, Penama, Shefa and Tafea province through several projects (see the map below).

Presentation of the project:

According to the UN World Risk Report (2012) Vanuatu has the highest disaster risk index of any country in the world. Considering its location on the ring of fire and the cyclone belt, Vanuatu is prone to geological and hydro-meteorological hazards which are increasing the communities' vulnerability.

Starts in 2010 the "Together, Becoming Resilient!" (TBR) program of the VRCS have been develop several DRR project in difference province of Vanuatu.

Torba has been identified, since the start of the program, as one of the most isolated provinces of the country with poor access to public services. Due to its location, it also constitutes one of the cyclone highest risk area in the country.

The French Red Cross is supporting the Vanuatu Red Cross in implementing the fifth phase of the project TBR in 25 communities in the Torba Province. This project is aiming at reducing Vanuatu vulnerability to disaster by develop provincial disaster plan, review community ones, and strength the capacity of the local stakeholder (Community Disaster Committees , Provincial disaster Committee, Are council secretary, NDMO...)

This project will be implementing under a consortium compose of 4 partners: Save the children (Lead), Care, Oxfam, Red Cross. This project is fund by ECHO .
