Increasing access to safe water for the affected population

1,425

people have directly benefited from construction and rehabilitation of rainwater collection systems across 5 islands. During the relief phase approximately 43,000 Litres of fresh water were distributed. Some water repairs have been completed in schools, churches and health facilities and latrine trainings have also been completed in a number of communities. All work has been focused on the most vulnerable households.
